RECReate...

The Project aims at reinforcing the existing cultural heritage. We want to use the Way of St James as a new tourist product to foster regional development in the South Baltic Area. We shall mobilise local communities around the joint initiative. The Route of St James has recently gained importance (it was added to the UNESCO list of cultural heritage in 1987). The European citizens want to return to the cultural roots of Europe. The Way of St James is to encourage people to move through different countries and regions more slowly so as to discover their diversity and understand their specificity. This corresponds to ancient habits when people spent hundreds of days moving to Santiago de Compostella and at the same time were exposed to cultural diversity, new ideas and development trends. The Route of St James also used to exist in the South Baltic Area stretching from Konigsberg through Gdańsk and Szczecin to Rostock and then continued westward. This Project aims at the restoration of this Route and joining the heritage of the South Baltic Area with a broader European network.

What are our objectives?

The main objective is socio-economic activation of the South Baltic Area through cross-border use of cultural heritage – preparation of a tourist product and promotional campaign encouraging its potential users to use it. What is equally important is the social development, for example - arousing social support and kindling enthusiasm for the idea of the Route and encouraging certain social groups that are normally not involved in tourist activities to visit neighbouring countries.









We want to help create social preconditions that may prove indispensable for further development of the regions participating in the project.

The Project Partners will pursue the following objectives:

- Using the cultural heritage and its networking for the establishment of the South Baltic tourist route connected to the wider European network;
- Creating preconditions for its extension to the East;
- Raising awareness of the existence of such a tourist product as the Way of St James amongst local populations and its potential users;
- Promoting and then testing the use of this product by social groups normally not involved in this type of tourism;

The main result to be achieved is more efficient use of the cultural heritage for development of tourism in the South Baltic Area. Our actions will be focused on activation of already existing, yet underused, potential requiring international cooperation with German and Lithuanian partners.

Intended main outputs of the Project:

- a film about the Pomeranian Route
- a trilingual guidebook
- a map
- the Internet guide
- a concept of winter pilgrimage
- at least a 120 km long road signposted according to the same standard
- professional tourist offer
- audio quides
- preparing local animators and volunteers to work along the Way of St James.

On Tuesday 21st June, in the Coat of Arms Hall at the Office of the Marshal in Gdańsk a conference on the creation of the Pomeranian Way of St James will be held.

The purpose of this meeting is working out the standards for efficient achievement of the intended objectives of the Project and, above all, establishing the route concept for the Way in cooperation with and with the approval of road and forest administrations so as to make the Way of St James in Pomorskie Voivodeship available to the tourists and pilgrims as soon as possible and in the best possible way.

Workshops in Greifswald

On 28th and 29th June workshops for people working in the fields of tourism and recreation and planning to work towards the revitalization of the Way of St James will be held. During the workshops the German partners will share their experience and know-how with the rest of the participants who will have a chance to present their own ideas and proposals as well. There will also be some lectures on pilgrimage tourism. The workshops will be closed by a study visit to the local pilgrimage route in the vicinity of Greifswald.
